The Foundation's mission is to ensure that young individuals, especially in underserved areas, have access to the resources and opportunities they need to build a better future. A key initiative of

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JKCPJ is the AI Learning Centre—an innovative project aimed at bridging the digital divide by introducing young people to the world of artificial intelligence and emerging technologies. Through hands-on training, interactive sessions, and project-based learning, the Centre equips students with essential skills in AI, machine learning, data literacy, and coding. This initiative not only imparts technical knowledge but also fosters creativity, critical thinking, and innovation—traits vital in today’s evolving world.

Scope of Cooperation:

The cooperation between Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University (SGTU) and the Jammu Kashmir Centre of Peace and Justice (JKCPJ) aims to promote academic collaboration, skills development, community outreach, and research. The partnership also includes providing students with hands-on experience through internships in areas relevant to their academic skills. This MoU outlines the shared goals of both institutions in enhancing student learning, providing valuable community engagement opportunities, and fostering collaboration in emerging fields such as AI.

General Areas of Cooperation:

1. **Student Internship Program:** As part of this MoU, students from various faculties at SGTU will be able to participate in a 1-month internship at JKCPJ or other related projects. Students will work on tasks aligned with the areas of cooperation, such as content writing, publicity generation, community outreach, AI learning, and educational support. Interns will contribute to real-world projects, applying their academic knowledge to gain valuable practical experience. Upon completion of the internship, the host organization will issue a Certificate of Completion and provide an evaluation and project completion report, which will be shared with both the host organization and the respective faculties. The student internship will be conducted in the following areas, with the respective faculties taking the lead in each initiative:


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2. **Content Writing, graphic design, branding and marketing:** Both institutions will collaborate on content creation, including articles, blog posts, and promotional materials. The Faculty of Mass Media and Technology will play a key role in ensuring that digital content is crafted and managed effectively for the websites, reflecting the ongoing activities and achievements of both institutions.
3. **Community Outreach Activities:** Joint efforts will be made in organizing community outreach programs targeting schools and underserved areas. The Faculty of Humanities, Social Sciences, and Liberal Arts will contribute their expertise in social research and community engagement to ensure these programs are impactful, culturally sensitive, and relevant to the needs of the local communities.
4. **Student Counseling:** As part of this cooperation, student counseling services will be provided, focusing on career guidance, mental health support, and personal development workshops. The Faculty of Behavioral Science will be instrumental in providing evidence-based guidance and support for students' academic, emotional, and social challenges.
5. **Centre of AI Learning:** The Centre of AI Learning will bridge the digital divide by offering training in AI and emerging technologies. The Faculty of Computer Science Engineering, along with the Faculty of Mass Media and Technology, will collaborate in providing technical expertise to students in AI, machine learning, coding, and other related fields. These faculties will help facilitate hands-on training, project-based learning, and the development of AI-related initiatives.
6. **Free Library Setup:** Both institutions will work together to establish free libraries in areas with limited educational resources. The Faculty of Education will support the setup of these libraries by providing necessary educational materials, as well as assisting in the development of curriculum and teaching resources for the libraries.
7. **Faculty of Mass Media and Technology:** This faculty will oversee the publicity generation efforts for collaborative events, initiatives, and programs. Their responsibilities will include managing social media campaigns, digital marketing, and event promotion, ensuring that both institutions' collaborative efforts are widely publicized and well-documented.
8. **Faculty of Education:** The Faculty of Education will assist in designing the curricula for educational outreach programs, providing resources for the free libraries, and helping facilitate workshops that promote both academic and personal development.

Through these collaborative efforts, SGTU and JKCPJ aim to empower students with the skills and knowledge they need to contribute meaningfully to society while enhancing educational opportunities for underrepresented communities.

For the purposes of this memorandum of agreement encompassing specific programs between SGTU and it is understood that a specific plan will be worked out for each activity; setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration will be agreed. Terms and conditions for each program, visit or an assignment or such exchange, including those concerning financial implications will be worked out



between both the parties. A separate agreement will be entered into giving such details including term of exchange of any intellectual property.

Boarding and lodging during faculty and student exchange:

The host institution will be responsible for the accommodation and local travel of the visiting faculty members and students at the university campus at a minimal cost. But if the visitors so desire they can arrange their own accommodation by bearing the applicable cost and the parent institution will be responsible for the same.

Intellectual & Technical Property Rights

In the course of collaboration between SGTU and RBU, participating individuals using proprietary materials and technologies acquired by either institution must adhere to intellectual property (IP) and technical property (TP) protection (e.g. material transfer agreement (TA) or license) pertaining to the relevant technologies and material. Protection of innovation, research products and other IP/TP (through patents, knowledge production rights, or other means) accruing from joint collaboration between SGTU and RBU will be done jointly following consultations with the relevant institutional IP/TP organs/panels on proprietary science and technology. Ownership and management of all TP and IP resulting from any collaboration shall be addressed in the written agreement governing each project.

Renewal, Termination and Amendment

This Memorandum of Understanding shall remain in force for a period of Three (3) years from the date of the last signature, with the understanding that either party giving written notice of 30 days to the other party in any year may terminate it. However, all prior and ongoing commitments made by the parties shall be completed in such eventualities, as agreed. The agreement may be extended by mutual consent of the two parties.

This Memorandum of Understanding may be amended by written amendment signed by the authorized persons at each institution.

The agreement shall be binding upon signing by authorized individuals of SGTU and shall be effective as of the date last written below.


Limitation of Liability

Neither party shall be liable for any negligent or wrongful acts, either of commission or omission, chargeable to the other, unless such liability is imposed by law. This MoU shall not be construed as seeking to either enlarge or diminish any obligation or duty owed by one party to the other or to a third party.

Confidential Information

During the tenancy of the MoU, both the parties will maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure of all the confidential information and data exchanged under the scope of this MoU for any purpose other

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than in accordance with this MoU. Each Party agrees to protect the Confidential Information disclosed to it with the same degree of care as it would use to protect its own confidential information of like nature, but not less than a reasonable degree of care, and agrees not to disclose to any third party the fact that the Confidential Information has been provided to or received from the other Party or that discussions are taking place between the Parties. Further, both the parties shall put in place adequate and reasonable measures to keep and store confidential information secure so as to prevent any unauthorized use.

Confidential Information for the purpose of this clause shall mean and include any and all information of a confidential nature whether disclosed in writing or not including the following without limitation

- (i) Technical and other information including, without limitation, current and future products, product development, business strategies and business forecasts and results, regulatory strategies, lifecycle management strategies, manufacturing, distribution, commercial practices, scientific data, processes, intellectual property and intellectual property strategies;
- (ii) Any information and/or materials relating, but not limited to, the business affairs, personnel, financial condition, operations, assets and/or liabilities or commercial interests of a Party and its Affiliates or of a third party to which the disclosing Party has lawful access that is disclosed pursuant to this Agreement;
- (iii) all personally identifiable information, such as name, title, address, telephone number and e-mail address ("Personal Data"); and
- (iv) information, data and results pertaining to tests and analysis performed with samples, if any.

Governing Law and Jurisdiction:


This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive Central and State laws of India. Any and all disputes, controversies and conflicts between or among the parties arising out of or relating with this agreement shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Gurugram.


Dispute Resolution:

In the event a dispute arises in connection with the validity, interpretation, implementation or alleged breach of this MOU, the parties shall attempt in the first instance to resolve such dispute through negotiation. If the dispute is not resolved through negotiation then either party may refer the dispute for resolution to the Arbitration under the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 or any subsequent enactment or amendment thereto, and the decision of the Arbitrator (whom shall be jointly appointed by both the parties) shall be binding upon both the parties. The seat of Arbitration shall be at Gurugram. The language of arbitration shall be English. The provisions of this Article shall survive the term/termination of this Agreement. Each party shall bear its own cost of the arbitration.

Indemnification

Each Party shall be responsible for its negligent acts or omissions and the negligent acts or omissions of its servants and agents. Each Party ("Defaulting Party") hereby undertakes and agrees to indemnify and


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keep and hold the other Party ("Non Defaulting Party") indemnified and harmless from and against all claims, proceedings, damages, losses, actions, costs and expenses arising as a consequence of or out of this MOU or arising from any breach of terms and conditions of this Agreement including any third party claims for infringement of intellectual property rights.

Independent Contractors

The status of the parties under this MOU shall be that of independent contractors. No party shall be authorized to waive any right or assume or create any contract or obligation of any kind in the name of, or on behalf of, the other or to make any statement that it has the authority to do so. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed as establishing a partnership, agency, employment, or other similar relationship between the parties hereto.

Partial Invalidity:

If any clause, paragraph, term or provision, of this MOU or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be invalid or unenforceable to any extent for any reason including by reason of any law or regulation or government policy, such clause, paragraph, term or provision shall be deemed several and the remainder of the MOU shall remain valid and enforceable.

Assignment

Neither Party shall assign this Agreement or its rights and obligation hereunder without the prior written consent of the other Party

No Financial Commitment Clause

This MOU is not a commitment of funds or any other financial implications towards either Institution.
