#### Between

Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University, established under the Haryana Private Universities (Amendment) Act No. 8 of 2013, having its campus at Gurgaon-Badli Road Chandu, Budhera, Gurugram, Haryana 122505, being represented by its Registrar (hereinafter referred to as "First Party")

#### And

Kalvi Career Education Private Limited, an approved training partner of National Skill Development Corporation ('NSDC') and a company registered under the Companies Act 2013, having CIN - U80900KA2021PTC152758, registered office at C258, Prestige Palms, ECC Road Whitefield, Bengaluru 560066 represented by its Chief Executive Officer (hereinafter referred to as "Second Party").

Second Party has approached the First Party for providing Second party's certification courses to the students of the First Party. The First Party has agreed to tie up with the Second Party to provide certification courses offered by the Second Party as listed in Annexure 1 for all the students of the First Party who have enrolled for the degree programs as listed in Annexure 2.

Both parties hereby have agreed to associate together, and the parties have agreed on the following terms for cooperation.

#### 1. Courses

The details and consideration of the certification courses is detailed out in Annexure 1. These courses will be offered to all the students of the First Party who are enrolled in the degree Program(s) as listed in Annexure 2.

### 2. Responsibilities of the First Party

- 2.1 The first party shall be responsible for providing all infrastructure facilities necessary for the conduct of the certification courses (refer to Annexure 1). Such facilities will be mutually agreed upon and include the following:
  - Classrooms with projectors, library access, computer labs access, IT devices, and work-ready infrastructure including comfortable chairs & working tables.
  - Access to other support facilities including printers, scanners, multimedia equipment, internet, faculty staff room, work area for course coordinators, admission process administrators and counselors, restrooms, and storage facility and shall bear the basic operational charges such as upkeep of classrooms, electricity, water charges, and any tax liabilities other than the liability of Second Party, etc.
  - Access to such other facilities as may be necessary for promotions and delivery of the Program.
- 2.2 Shall enroll all the students admitted in the degree programs listed in Annexure 2 into all the courses offered by the Second Party as defined in Annexure 1.
- 2.3 Shall remit the agreed upon fee as collected from the students to the Second Party for the certification courses listed in Annexure 1.
- 2.4 Shall take care of all regulatory requirements and stipulations for the award of degrees to students who successfully complete the degree Program(s) listed in Annexure 2.

### 3. Responsibilities of Second Party

### The Second Party

- 3.1 Shall be responsible for Certification courses' design & development, course content, instruction plan, course execution & delivery, and up-gradation of certification courses in consultation with the First Party and approved by the Board of Studies and other bodies as per the First Party's concerned rules
- 3.2 Shall conduct awareness and counseling webinars and sessions to help with marketing efforts by First
- 3.3 Shall deploy faculty with suitable training, education, skills, and experience as mentors to deliver its certification courses
- 3.4 Shall provide the first party's faculty with suitable training to deliver the certification courses as required and mutually agreed from time to time.
- 3.5 Shall manage faculty operations and monitor the delivery of certification courses in physical mode on the campus of First Party as per the guidelines of the First Party, and the faculty and guest lecturers shall be bound by the administrative academic and other related directions, control, and policy of the First Party, but the First Party shall have no obligation towards faculty, staff, or guest lecturers of the Second Party.
- 3.6 Shall make sure that: The faculty members, trainers, and industry experts appointed to teach the courses and/or mentor the students shall be reviewed by the First Party before engaging them in any activity. The performance of the appointed faculty members, trainers, and industry experts shall be periodically reviewed on parameters mutually decided by both parties including student feedback.
- 3.7 Shall deploy its proprietary learning management platform that contains course modules, live books, assessments, etc to the students enrolled in the program and shall bear all costs of development and hosting.
- 3.8 Shall carry out examinations and assessments that will be continuous in nature for all courses. This will be in agreement with the consent of the First Party. All of the assessments will be hosted on the Second Party's online platform.
- 3.9 Shall be responsible to facilitate industry campus interaction, talks by industry guest speakers, and industry visits for program students as per the regulations/stipulations of the First Party
- 3.10 Shall be responsible for providing certificates to the students after successful completion of each course offered by the Second Party as mentioned in Annexure 1.
- 3.11 Regarding the Internship and Placement Component of the certification course, Second Party:
  - Shall be responsible for facilitating the final year internships of the certification course by securing opportunities for the students enrolled in the Program on profile and stipend as agreed upon mutually by both parties.
  - Shall be responsible to seek the feedback of industry, students and other stakeholders regarding internship components on parameters mutually decided between both the parties and take corrective action to ensure the quality and other mutually agreed objectives are met.
  - Shall be responsible for facilitating placement opportunities for students who successfully complete the certification course and register for placement.

#### 4. Fee Structure

4.1 The fees details for the certification courses offered by the Second Party have been detailed out in Annexure 1.

### 5. Fee payment

- 5.1 The First Party will collect the total program fees from the students for the degree programs listed in Annexure 2, as per its policy. This includes the fee paid by the students for enrolment in the certification courses offered by the Second Party as described in Annexure 1, which shall be remitted to the Second Party as per the manner stipulated below.
- 5.2 The First Party will pay the Second Party the agreed-upon fee at the start of each academic semester. Any adjustments due to the withdrawal of students and admission cancellations will be done during the payment in the subsequent Semester.
- 5.3 The payment against the undisputed invoice shall be made within 7 days from the date of raising the invoice.
- 5.4 Any refunds that may accrue to students who withdraw from a Program after registration would be as per the refund rules of the First Party. Any amount retained from such Program fees paid by the prospective student will be prorated between the two parties after deduction of processing and other charges.

### 6. Admission Cycle

6.1 The admission cycle for degree Program(s) listed in Amnexure 2. will be as per the First Party norms. The Second Party's marketing team will interact with the First Party and finalize the admission timelines. The Second Party will conduct a separate selection process in concurrence with the First Party on admitting only those students whom they deem fit to succeed in the certification course listed in Annexure 2.

### 8. Intellectual Property

- 8.1 Any IP generated as an outcome of the Program by students will be owned by both parties. The Parties agree that any material jointly created by the Parties for the collaboration shall be jointly owned (based on the Contributions) by the Parties, unless otherwise agreed in writing. Ownership and management of all Intellectual Property and Technical Property resulting from any collaboration shall be addressed in the written agreement governing each project. This may include any royalty accrued from research work by students as mutually decided between the parties.
- 8.2 Any credit for any successful startup launched by the students of the Program will be jointly claimed by both parties.

### 9. Indemnification and confidentiality

- 9.1 Both Parties hereby indemnifies each other and agree to keep indemnified and hold harmless at all times for and against all kinds of losses, damages, expenses, suits, costs, liabilities including civil and criminal liabilities and police action of all kinds and other consequences etc. of whatsoever nature that may arise or occur due to any of the act or omission of either Party or violation/non-adherence to any law, bye-laws, rules, regulations, guidelines or directives etc. whatever it may be called enforced by any Central/State Government or local administration or other concerned statutory or regulatory authority and/or breach/non-compliance of any term of this Agreement at any stage also including such act or omission, breach/non-compliance etc. on the part of its staff, personnel and other concerned.
- 9.2 Either Party will not disclose any proprietary information that is provided to it by the other Party under this Agreement or which that Party may have acquired or comes into its knowledge during this collaboration term or even otherwise in any form and manner, with any third Party and/or to use for any purpose other than for which such information is required for carrying out its obligations under this Agreement or otherwise is required to disclose in discharge of the obligation under any law/statutes or towards its concerned statutory/regulatory authority whatever it may be called. Such information may include, policies, internal workings of Parties, data, other proprietary information of either Party including but not limited to the trade practices, strategies, or product development plans of either Party ("Confidential Information"). Further, the parties shall also not use any information, data etc. of students, staff etc. at any stage in any manner and for any purpose. Each Party agrees to prevent unauthorised access to or dissemination of the proprietary and confidential Information of the other Party. Each Party acknowledges and agrees that it shall be responsible to ensure its employees' adherence to the confidential obligations set forth in this clause. However, this restriction does not apply to information which: (a) either Party independently developed without reference to or use of the confidential information of the other Party; (b) is in public domain without breach of the confidentiality obligation or made public by any Party; (c) is disclosed with the other Party's prior written approval; or (d) is revealed pursuant to court or regulatory order or mandatory process of Law, provided the Party gave as much advance written notice to the other Party as possible (to the extent not prohibited by Law) regarding the disclosure
- 9.3 The provisions contained in this Clause 9.2 shall also survive the expiry/termination/non-continuation of this Agreement.

### 10. Duration of the Agreement

- 10.1 This Agreement shall remain valid and binding upon both the parties for a duration of 5 years, effective from the date on which it is signed. Renewal will be on a yearly basis and batch-wise.
- 10.2 If in any case, either Party decides against the further renewal of this agreement, after the expiry of this agreement it shall be the responsibility of both the First Party and the Second Party to ensure that the enrolled students (at the time of expiry of the agreement) continue and complete the course as per provisions of this agreement and for this purpose, the agreement shall be operatives unless otherwise agreed between the two parties per extant provision.

### 11. Termination of Agreement

- 11.1 The parties shall be entitled to terminate this agreement by mutual agreement in writing.
- 11.2 Either Party shall be entitled to terminate this agreement in case of a material breach by either Party of any of its obligations or representations and warranties under this agreement which remains unremedied for a period of 90 working days. Additionally, either Party may terminate the agreement by giving 3 months of notice. In case of Termination of the agreement, both parties shall execute their responsibilities as agreed in clauses 2 and 3 for all ongoing programs.

### 12. Arbitration

- 12.1 Any dispute arising with regard to any aspect of this Agreement shall be settled through mutual consultation and by written consent by the parties to the Agreement. - 12.2 The term First Party and the Second Party aforementioned unless repugnant to the context shall mean and include their successors in office, authorized representatives and assignees, etc.

#### 13. Jurisdiction

13.1 In the event of any disputes between the parties no court case shall be preferred by either Party until Arbitration has been resorted to and proved unfruitful, preferably in the courts at Gurgaon, Haryana subject to the aforesaid arbitration clause, the competent courts at Gurgaon, Haryana shall have the jurisdiction to hear and decide any matter between the parties.

### 14. Force Majeure

- 14.1 Notwithstanding hereinbefore mentioned, this Agreement shall be deemed to have been suspended for the period during which and to the extent to which either Party hereto is prevented, hindered or delayed from performing any part of this contract by reason and any cause or circumstances of Force Majeure and which cannot be overcome by diligence and such affected Party shall be excused from such performance to the extent that it was necessarily of events, such a happening or event shall include, but not be limited to Acts of God, any restriction, regulation, order, acts of omission or operation by any central. State, Local, Municipal, or any other authority concerned, wars, fire, explosion, etc. The Parties hereto recognize that the policy in relation to the prohibition of any business activity by Central, State, Local, Municipal, or any other authority concerned has a vital bearing on the ability of either of the Parties hereto in fulfillment of its obligations mentioned in the Agreement.
- 14.2 Neither Party shall be liable to compensate any loss, damage, or delay caused by war, riots, agitation, lock-outs, labor trouble or infrastructural deficiency, commotion, any other cause or contingencies beyond the reasonable control which prevents or delays it in performing any obligation incurred under or arising out of this Agreement.

### 15. Amendment to the Agreement

15.1 During the operation of the agreement circumstances may arise which may call for amendment/alteration in the agreement, which shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing and shall form the part and parcel of the original agreement.

### 16. Notices

16.1 Any notice or other communication under or in connection with this agreement shall be in writing, in English, and shall be transmitted by facsimile, e-mail or recognized courier service addressed to the intended recipients under this agreement.

### 17. Entire Agreement:

17.1 This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter and supersedes any prior oral or written agreements, representations, arrangements, understandings, or communication. Any amendment hereto will be in writing and signed by both parties.

### ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSIONS CRITERIA The following is the eligibility criteria for being able to apply to the Program listed in Annexure 1

1 The student should be appearing for the final school level examination(+2 board exam) in the current academic year or should have completed the same in the previous academic year at the time of applying for the Program from an approved board of school studies from India or abroad.

2. The student should have studied Maths, Physics, and Chemistry subjects in the final school level examination(+2 board exam)

- 3. The student should have secured 60% aggregate marks in the final school level examination(+2 board exam) or as required by the university
- 4. The student should have appeared for the Kalvium National Entrance Test (KNET)

### Kalvium National Entrance Test (KNET)

The KNET comprises questions from 5 areas -

- 1. Numeracy: Evaluates the general math ability of the candidate
- 2. Data Interpretation: Tests the candidate's ability to interpret and analyze data
- 3. Verbal Reasoning: Assesses the candidate's capacity for logical reasoning and decision-making
- 4. Problem Solving and Algorithmic Thinking: Assesses the candidate's ability to apply algorithmic thinking to solve complex problems
- 5. English Comprehension: Examines the language proficiency and comprehension skills of the candidates

### Joint Undertaking on Placement Assurance and Eligibility Criteria

Kalvium will provide assured placements opportunities to Students who successfully meet all the below mentioned criteria, including academic performance, attendance, professional development activities, & communication skills during the final year of the program. These students will be placed in a salary range of 15 to 40 LPA (Lakhs Per Annum). While some students could land jobs with higher offers also, this salary range reflects the competitive skills and capabilities developed by the students during their academic journey.

- 1. Semester-wise Attendance Requirement: The student must maintain a minimum attendance of 80% in each semester across all sessions or as per university guidelines whichever is higher.
- 2. Academic Performance Requirement: The student is required to have 7.0 GPA or percentage of 70 or more across all courses across years.
- 3. Academic Performance Arrears Limit: The student must have zero history of arrears during the entire program.
- 4. Skill Development Activities:
  - a. Tech Proficiency Coding: The student will choose their career pathways latest starting 4th semester, and will meet the required coding proficiency for the pathway.
