1. Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences

The Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences was set up in 2010 as SGT Medical College, Hospital & Research Institute with the objective to offer medical education and research programmes and provide healthcare services to the needy in its surrounding areas at affordable cost. Presently, this Faculty offers MBBS programme, while M.D. (Doctor of Medicine) programme is in the offing. The MBBS course was launched from the academic session 2010-11 with an intake of 100 students per annum with the approval of Medical Council of India (Letter No MCI.34(41)/2010/Med./918 dated 15.07.2010).

Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences has a 500-bed multi-specialty Hospital attached to it for the hands on training and skill development of the budding players in medical field. The Hospital is very well-equipped with the most advanced facilities in the area and caters to the needs of rural and urban populace around Gurgaon. The highly experienced consultants in all specialities such as Surgery, Medicine, Obstetrics & Gynecology, Ear, Nose & Throat, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Tuberculosis & Chest, Psychiatry, Skin & Venereal Diseases, Radiology, Anesthesiology, Pediatrics and Radio-diagnosis, man the hospital and provide best health services.

At present, there are four lecture theaters of 180 capacity and one of 350 capacity. The lecture theaters are equipped with audio – visual aids and other modern facilities for e-classes.

SGT University Hospital

Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary Hospital located in Village Budhera, Gurgaon is a 500 bedded hospital, a constituent hospital of SGT University.

It is a well equipped, multispecialty hospital with the most advanced facilities in this area catering to the needs of rural and urban population around Gurgaon. The hospital has experienced consultants in all specialties such as General Medicine, Paediatrics, Respiratory Disease, Skin & VD, Physiotherapy, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, ENT, Eye, OBS & Gynecology, Anesthesiologist and Radio Diagnosis.

The hospital has modern infrastructure and provision to provide appropriate care to patients of accident, medical and surgical emergency as well as to provide intensive care to newborn children, cardiac and respiration patients. The intensive care is also provided to burns patients in the burns ICU.

All types of surgeries (conventional as well as laparoscopic) are performed at affordable cost by highly experienced and qualified surgeons belonging to various surgical specialties like general surgery, Orthopaedics, ENT, Eye and OBS & Gynec in the OT complex which is equipped with latest equipments and has state-of-art infrastructure.

In addition, the hospital has well equipped central diagnostic laboratories as well as Radiodiagnosis department. Both these investigating departments function round the clock and facilitate in-patient care all through the day on nominal charges.

The hospital has all major OPD's running daily. The Operation Theatres are equipped with ventilator, defibrillator multi paramonitors being taken care of by full time anesthetists. All types of general surgeries, gynecological surgeries, ENT/Eye surgeries and laboratory tests are being done at reasonable, subsidized charges for the poor people of the region.

In addition to medical services our hospital has 24 hrs emergency and trauma care, ambulance, pharmacy shop and diagnostics services. The hospital is well connected to Gurgaon and other towns around the area. The hospital buses also bring the patients to the hospital for treatment.

Other Facilities

Apart from the above, the hospital also maintains, Operation Theatres Ambulance facility, Diagnostic Laboratories, Radio-diagnosis, Medical services Emergency & Trauma Care, Intensive Coronary Care Unit, ICU (Medical, Surgical, Neonatal, Paediatrics, Respiratory & Burns), Blood Bank, Pharmacy Store, Hospital kitchen and Mess facility.

Departments:

Presently the faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences includes the department of General Medicine, Paediatrics, TB & Chest, Skin & VD, Psychiatry, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, Eye, ENT, Gynecology, Anesthesiology, Radiology, Clinical Labs.

2. Faculty of Dental Sciences

The SGT Dental College, Hospital & Research Institute, established in 2002, became the Faculty of Dental Sciences with the advent of the SGT University from the academic session 2013-14. This Faculty offers undergraduate (BDS), postgraduate (MDS) in all specialities) and Ph.D. programmes in all branches of dental sciences.

The Dental Hospital provides a very sound platform for the students to sharpen their clinical skill in denture treatment, besides committing itself to provide state-of-the-art facilities for indoor and outdoor patients and health care services to the people in its abutting areas. The Outpatient Department of the Hospital receives about half a thousand patients every day. The Hospital equipped with the modern facilities in its all the nine specialized departments where basic and advanced dental treatments and minor, major and complex surgeries are performed daily. The Hospital runs a fleet of six buses for to and fro transport of the patients from the adjoining fifty villages at no cost to them.

Besides providing oral health screening services, the oral health care devices-tooth brushes, tooth pastes and medicines are also distributed free of cost in many neighboring villages and schools. The Hospital provides 24 x 7 emergency services.

Continuous dental health programmes are held for the awareness and motivation of the rural people. The students of this erstwhile college have topped in the university examinations and secured medals in different subjects. They have also bagged various awards and trophies in sports and other co-curricular competitions. Our postgraduate students have won about half a dozen

educational and institutional awards ever since the commencement of this programme five years ago.

Our Dental OPD which is attended by more than 500 patients every day. There is state-of-the-art indoor facility with 9 specialized dental departments wherein basic dental treatments and advanced treatments like minor and major surgeries, complex implant surgeries, trauma and cleft lip & cleft palate cases are performed daily. To cater to maximum patients, the hospital is running 6 buses giving free service to bring patients from 45 - 50 villages. Under Public Health Dentistry, the hospital is providing oral health screening & distributing oral health care devices like toothbrushes, toothpastes and medicines for free in many neighboring villages & schools.

Regular oral screening surveys have been conducted through-out the year for the school children (school health program) and other people in villages and school. The systematic annual program of conducting out-reach oral health services camps have also been a limelight of the college with huge numbers of treatment procedures being conducted for the rural population. The dental camps have concentrated on oral health prevention, promotion and treatment at various places like where our dental teams of staff members, postgraduates and interns are posted. These programs also include oral health education protocols to improve the knowledge about oral health. Specific targeted approach was used to educate school children about their oral health. These kinds of activities not only confined to nearby 150 villages but also have reached to distance of 50 km to 100 km from the institute. In the past 3 years from 2010 to 2012 we have organized more than 300 out-reach camps and we have screened more than 75000 patients at the camps. They have been provided basic oral health care at the camp sites and advanced treatments at the college.

The Faculty is in collaboration with the University of Detroit-Mercy, Michigan, USA for the international exposure of our students and faculty through annual exchange programmes.

3. Faculty of Nursing

Initially, this Faculty was established as Dashmesh College of Nursing and re-named as the Faculty of Nursing in 2013 when it was taken over by the SGT University. This Faculty offers four Bachelor and Diploma courses, namely B.Sc. (Nursing), Post Basic B.Sc. (Nursing), General Nursing & Midwifery, and Auxiliary Nursing & Midwives.

The courses being conducted by the Faculty are recognized by the Haryana Nurses Registration Council (HNRC) and the Indian Nursing Council (INC). Faculty strives for:

- Value-based Nursing Education ;
- Continuous improvement of conducive environment, for learning , practice and research;
- Being of par with International standards;
- Overall development of staff and students; and
- Enhanced student's satisfaction.

Besides the infrastructure and the Faculty, the well-equipped laboratories and clinics of various departments of the University, viz. Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences support various academic and research activities.

Teachers determined the quality of education. The Faculty has a lineup of well-qualified teachers with rich professional experience background, intellectually and morally, superior teams of teachers will certainly turn out better quality students.

4. Faculty of Allied Health Sciences

This Faculty came into existence in 2010 as an “Institute of Paramedical Sciences” with affiliation to Punjab Technical University. It was rechristened as Faculty of Allied Health Sciences with the advent of SGT University in 2013. The Faculty now offers seven job-oriented programmes, viz. B.Sc. (Medical Laboratory Technology), B.Sc. (Operation Theatre Technology), B.Sc. (Radio-Imaging Technology), B.Sc. (Optometry), B.Sc. Nutrition & Dietetics, Dip. In Medical Laboratory Technology, Dip. in Operation Theatre Technology, and Dip. in Radio-Imaging Technology. We began this journey as learning center and now, we can proudly say that the SGT University has a full-fledged “ Faculty of Allied Health Sciences”.

The Faculty is functioning under the supervision of Director of Medicine and Health Sciences; and is headed by Dr. Bhuvnesh Yadav as Officer – in-Charge. The Faculty of Allied Health Sciences has qualified teachers to impart quality education to the students of these courses. In addition, the students of different courses are taking hands-on training in the University under the guidance of the elite faculty. It is our pleasure to work with numerous adjunct faculties of the University and hospital. We hold true to our mission to prepare students with the knowledge, skill and characteristics necessary to be competent, compassionate

professionals who contribute to the field of allied health sciences. We look forward to contributing more in the academic and extracurricular activities.

5. Faculty of Physiotherapy

This Faculty took the first stride in 2008 with the commencement of Bachelor of Physiotherapy programme. It was followed by the introduction of Master of Physiotherapy programme in four streams- Orthopedics, Cardiopulmonary, Neurology and Sports in 2011. The Faculty has a well-equipped hospital attached to it, and has achieved a mark for its excellent services in the neighboring area because of the dedicated and committed efforts made by the most experienced teaching faculty.

The Faculty has state-of-the-art exercise therapy and electrotherapy laboratories with latest machines and equipments for students to practice.

Library has an excellent collection of the books on health sciences and various national and international journals. In addition to this, library is equipped with computer and internet facilities for e-learning.

The OPD is within the SGT Hospital. The establishment of the Physiotherapy Department has come up as a boon for the people of nearby villages who were earlier unaware of what Physiotherapy is all about and could not afford costly treatment in the corporate hospitals. This year, Physiotherapy OPD witnessed numerous musculoskeletal and neurological cases from nearby rural areas. Besides treating their problem, they were also guided on various preventive methods and ergonomic care to prevent recurrence of their problems related to their work or job profile.

The faculty added another feather in its cap with the induction of Masters'Degree Programmes in Physiotherapy (MPT) in the year 2011. The programme provides specialization in 4 streams- Orthopedics, Cardiopulmonary, Sports Rehabilitation & Neuro-physiotherapy.

6. Faculty of Commerce and Management

The SGT University is committed to uphold its objective of imparting quality education to transform young minds into better human resource for performing a leading role in the society. And, hence, the Faculty of Commerce and Management of the University was established for preparing the students to make them the frontier Professionals in the disciplines of Commerce and Management. Initially, the Faculty has introduced undergraduate programmes of

Bachelor in Commerce (Pass and Honors) and B.B.A. (General and Hospital Administration) to make the students ready for the corporate sector and health services

The academic curriculum, pedagogy and teaching methods include class room learning, group discussions, role playing, case studies, management games, presentations, assignments, faculty and industry interface, industry visits and guest lectures for making coordinated efforts to ensure value based perspective. Thus, the students are not only exposed in management areas rather they are prepared to be humane managers and agents of change. For the successful accomplishment of the programmes, the University provides excellent infrastructure facilities in terms of Class Rooms, Seminar Rooms, well-stocked Library, computing and Internet Labs including games and residential facilities.

7. Faculty of Law

The Faculty of Law at SGT University came in to effect in May 2014. It offers BA LLB (Hons.)/BBA LL.B (Hons.)-5 Year Integrated Degree Programme, LLB-3 Year Degree Programme and One Year LL.M Degree Programme.

The mission of the Faculty of Law is to develop competent professionals by imparting education of the highest academic standards and equipping the students by providing them opportunities for internship at the end of the every trimester with practicing lawyers, NGOs and leading law firms in the country.

Alongside their classroom pursuits the Faculty of Law aims at organizing Seminars, Conferences, and Competitions so as to provide the students an opportunity to involve themselves in learning through research and interacting with renowned legal luminaries. The faculty also aims at organizing outreach activities beneficial to the communities and for this purpose has established Legal Aid Cell to create legal awareness among the people and to train students in establishing links with the communities.

8. Faculty of Hotel and Tourism Management

The recent liberalization of trade and opening up of economy to international players led to the exponential growth of Indian Hospitality Industry. In the last few years, India has become the most favored destination for the investors both in the tourism as well as hospitality industry. And therefore, the growing demand for well-trained quality personnel has opened ample job opportunities in this field which have transcended the national boundaries through chains of hotels which operate at international level. If one is innovative, creative and can serve with a smile, this industry is the perfect destination where sky is the limit. Hotel Management programmes includes a cluster of courses in which students are equipped with the skills to run hotels and restaurants. Fast Food service

organizations, airlines, BPOs, catering departments of railways, banks, armed forces, shipping companies, club management, cruise lines, customer care, forest lodges, guest houses, facility management, hospitals and hospital administration are the other sectors where hotel management, graduates can look for jobs in India and abroad. Thus, visualizing the numerous career options in this sector, the Faculty of Hotel and Tourism Management was established in 2014 and started Bachelor of Hotel Management course from the academic session 2013-14. The SGT University has a tie-up with the chain of New Age Group of Hotel and Resorts at premier destinations in North India. These hotels will provide necessary operational exposure to the students who wish to pursue their career in the hospitality and tourism sector. The University also maintains a 665-bed hospital along with accommodation for its employees and student in its campus which may further help the students to undergo the practical exposure of catering industry. Besides teaching, the students are encouraged to have a personal rapport with the faculty through tutorials to discuss any of their personal or course related problems thereby continuously counsel them for their improvement. Industry visits are organized from time to time to give industrial exposure to the students for learning skills to adapt to the environment where they would look for employment. Industry experts are invited to talk to the students about latest trends in the hospitality sector with question-answer sessions. We, at FHTM, provide stimulating teaching and learning environment by providing AV modes of teaching, well-equipped labs for practicals and Wi-Fi facilities. The students are deputed to the industry for on-the-job training for a period of more than one year for attaining the skill required for their future growth. Our focus rests on integration of our curricula with the needs and demands of industry. We nurture students who will lead the organization of the future where they can apply their talent and knowledge.

9. Faculty of Mass & Media Communication

In a world where the use of digital technology continues to increase at a swift pace, the field of Journalism and Mass Communication offers an exciting arena to build a career. Today, the application of digital technology and innovative practices are providing better alternatives for communication and sharing of information with the entire gamut of populace. And, thus, in this changing scenario, for the ambitious students who wish to find professional career in Journalism and Mass Communication and film making, the University has set up the Faculty of Mass Communication and Media Technology in 2014 to offer a host of courses. Besides the B.A. (Journalism and Mass Communication) which the Faculty started in 2014-15, B.Sc. (Film Making) will be offered from the academic session 2016-17.

The objective of starting Mass Communication & Media Technology courses is to prepare competent human resource by imparting high quality education and training to meet regional, national and international demand and expectations. It will be our endeavour to integrate the traditional values of journalism with technological advancements. The students pursuing these programmes besides learning how to find news, and how to prepare news report, the ethics of journalism, the rights and duties of a journalist, use of language for effective communication, new skills essential in the digital world including broadcasting and online journalism, technologies for film making, etc.

10. Faculty of Physical Sciences

After having realized the desired goal in health and engineering education, the SGT University turned its attention to other branches of knowledge. The basic sciences—Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics—occupy a place of importance in the priority list, being mothers of all applied sciences. This entailed the establishment of Faculty of Physical Sciences in 2014-15 to impart theoretical and practical knowledge of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. The main objective of the Faculty is to nurture the students to develop critical and analytical thinking, imbibe problem solving skills and understand basic concepts of sciences. In an era of increasing technical complexity, the knowledge of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and other related areas helps in evaluating scientific claims and developing industrial, agricultural, medical and other technologies. The courses in these disciplines equip the students to find career opportunities in educational and research institutions, chemical industry, pharmaceutical industry, ceramic industry, steel industry, energy sector, manufacturing industry, aerospace industry, agriculture, and so on. Which require broad scientific background and research orientation? The course curriculum has been developed to meet the international standards so that our students could compete for jobs with the best. It is our endeavour to mould our students into inquisitive minds with rich subject knowledge. If you are looking for careers in these areas, SGT University is a place to fulfill your aspirations.

10. Faculty of Behavioural Sciences

Clinical psychology is the branch of psychology concerned with the assessment and treatment of mental illness, abnormal behavior and psychiatric problems. This field puts together the science of psychology and the treatment of complex human problems. The SGT University established the Faculty of Behavioural Health Sciences in August 2014 to offer graduate and postgraduate programmes, namely B. Sc. (Clinical Psychology) and M. Sc. (Clinical Psychology). The mission of faculty will continue to keep engaged in teaching

and research programmes and enhance its capacity to offer the education in order to direct and increase understanding about mental health, human behavior, human development, learning and other activity. The degree holders in this discipline have ample job opportunities in a variety of sectors such as education, counselors in educational institutions from schools to • universities, hospitals, etc.

University Library

The Central Library – Knowledge Resource Center at Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University has fully air conditioned excellent library with state of art facilities and with huge collection of latest books and journals, national and international and other learning resources, both in print and electronic forms. The library has been carefully designed to have more space and natural lighting for the comfort of readers. It can accommodate more than 450 students at a time. It covers an extensive set of features with a simple user interface.

The reference section includes a vast collection of reference books, handbooks, dictionaries, encyclopedias, CD-ROMs on varied subjects such as Medical Sciences, Dental Sciences, Allied Health Sciences, Management, Engineering, Computer Sciences, Humanities, and Literature etc.

Library has a well-maintained Digital Library with on-line connectivity of twenty terminals. It is very useful for information seekers. CHAPTER - 6
ADMISSION PROCEDURE
(As per 1st Ordinance of the University)

Admission in the University is made strictly on the basis of merit.

Merit for admission in the University may be determined either on the basis of marks or grades obtained in the entrance test conducted by University or the marks obtained in the qualifying examination. However, the admission in professional and technical courses is made only through an entrance test.

Unfilled / dropout vacant seats in professional and technical courses is filled up by the University at their own level by considering the marks obtained by the applicants in the qualifying examination and on the basis of their inter-se-merit.
